President's Message

I'm very pleased to present our first play for 2021- even if it is a little later than planned.

Last year, we all took a not-too-deep breath, and gathered online instead of in the theatre, because we didn't want to do nothing, and because our community needed us. Within a few months, we gathered every other week to watch a play together, or read a play together, all through the new media of online meetings. This was hard work, not just for the committee members who organised it all, but also for every member who had to learn not to leave themselves on mute, or remind themselves to put pants on despite not having to leave the house.

Other people noticed that we weren't in hiatus, and we recorded plays for them. For students of our local schools. For the Arts North-West Captain Isobolt film. We even provided talent to local TV advertising projects, and to other short films.

We didn't waver in our support of our local government's bid for a new cultural precinct. We lobbied for performers, artists, and for cultural activities not to be left behind, not to be jettisoned on our community's search for a safe harbour. We didn't forget our friends, our supporters, the local businesses who have helped us. The work is ongoing, it never stops- being good cultural citizens is so important, and we are helping shape our community.

We also spent 2020 reviewing our internal policies and procedures. Most importantly we adopted a Code of Conduct against Workplace Discrimination, Harrassment, Sexual Harrassment and Bullying. This policy is aligned with the best-practice our industry peak bodies recommend, and works within our constitution.

Our members also took the chance to improve their skills through our Phyllis Giblin fund, with NIDA online courses in technical theatre design disciplines. We updated our accounting package, our banking practices, our storage facility, and our stocktaking system. We did not let a good pandemic go to waste.

As we look forward to a more conventional year, TDS is looking better than a mess of fried catfish. That's good, by the way, and by the end of Steel Magnolias you might be using some North Louisiana dialect yourself!. Gero and the rest of the team have worked very hard on a fantastic play, and we are thrilled for them to welcome you back to the Capitol Theatre.


